Spaulding started in 1968 with the belief that families are essential to the healthy development of children. Throughout its history, Spaulding has developed solutions and services on behalf of families and children. Today, Spaulding develops and provides research-based training curricula that the states, tribes and territories can use to equip those interested in becoming foster and adoptive parents.



“I want to raise their awareness about the reality kids in foster care experience. What I want kids to know is they should find someone – a teacher who cares, a janitor at school, a neighbor down the street – someone to talk with who affirms your existence.”

DEBORAH'S STORY

With six siblings, Deborah Wilson entered foster care at age 6. When her first caregivers failed to live up to their responsibilities, she came to feel like an outcast. Deborah said she thought no one understood or appreciated her.

After a failed adoption, Deborah was placed in a relative foster home through Spaulding for Children. The youngster discovered people who understood her and what she was experiencing. Through Spaulding, she said, she developed a new mindset and stayed positive in her home, reunited with two sisters, and at school. Deborah received scholarships through Spaulding and Western Michigan University, where she received a bachelor's degree in communication.

Today at 26, Ms. Wilson works full time as a corporate recruiter in Detroit. She plans to earn a master's in counseling psychology to help young people realize they can get through tough childhoods. She also wants to help them know they aren't alone – and what they need to do, so they can set their own course in life and make a difference for others.

HOW WE BUILT STRONGER FAMILIES

We kept children from entering foster care by teaching and supporting their parents to safely care for them in their homes.

We supported and empowered families to overcome their challenges and eliminated safety concerns so that their children could be safely reunited with them.

We provided mentoring support for foster youth.

We found permanent families for children and youth who needed one; they are now thriving in the care of their adoptive families.

We provided scholarship funds to support foster youth interested in higher education.

Through grant projects, we created products and materials to equip families caring for children with a history of trauma.

H-BASS

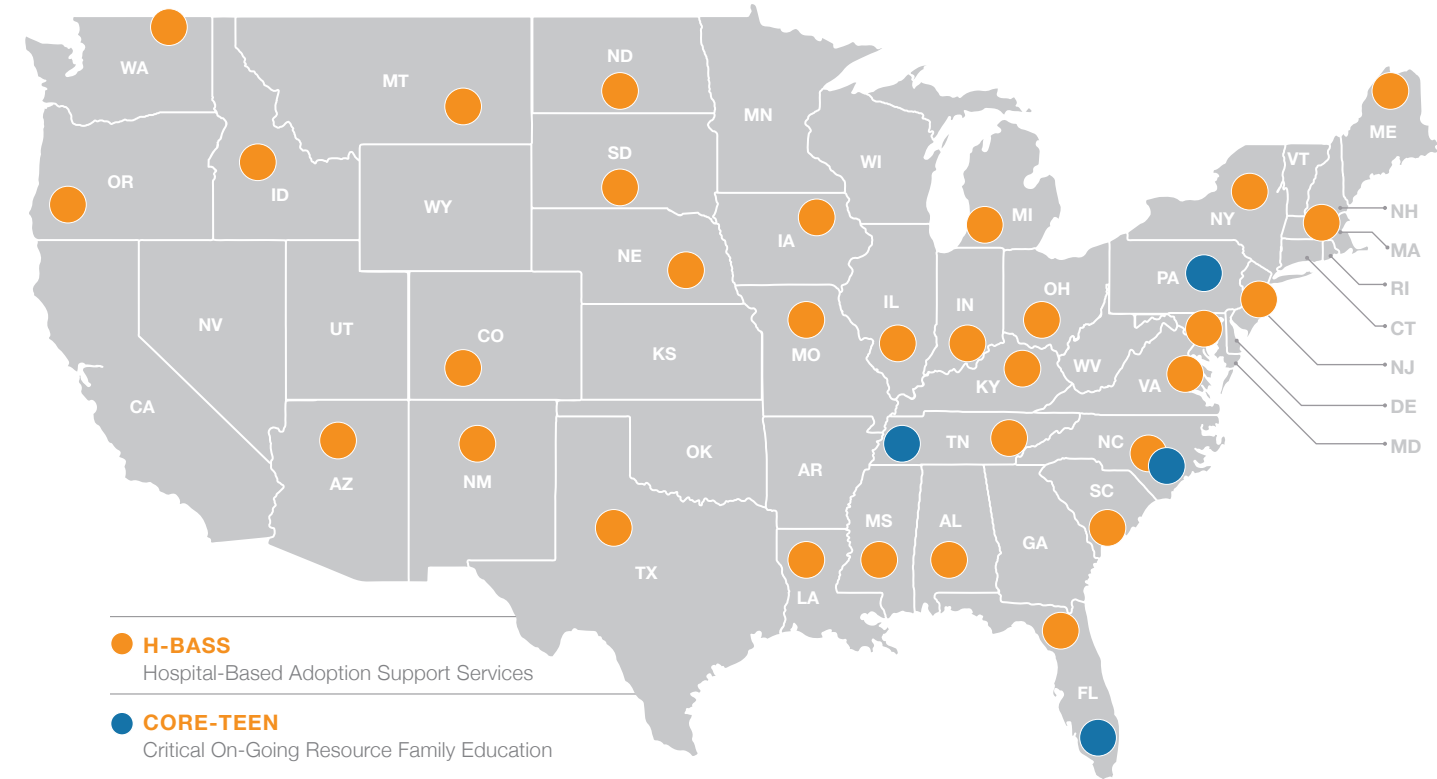
The Hospital-Based Adoption Support Services (H-BASS) helps ensure pregnant women who wish to place a child for adoption have access to well-trained staff and comprehensive supports in hospital settings throughout the adoption process. The Understanding Infant Adoption training curriculum helped build and develop the capacity of hospital-based staff to respond to pregnant women.

H-BASS team reached out to 3,699 individuals in approximately 1,850 hospitals in the 31 states.

CORE-TEEN

The Critical On-Going Resource Family Education (CORE-Teen) program serves as a state-of-the-art training program to equip resource parents to meet the needs of older youth who have moderate to severe emotional and behavioral challenges who require intensive and coordinated services and may be at risk for more restrictive congregative care.

The CORE-Teen team trained caregivers in Florida, Tennessee, Pennsylvania, the Eastern Band of Cherokee, and North Carolina.



THE ACADEMY FOR FAMILY SUPPORT & PRESERVATION

QIC-AG

The National Quality Improvement Center for Support and Preservation (QIC-AG) provided evidence-based support and intervention to achieve long-term, stable permanency in adoptive and guardianship homes for waiting children. The models are replicated and adapted by child welfare systems across the nation.



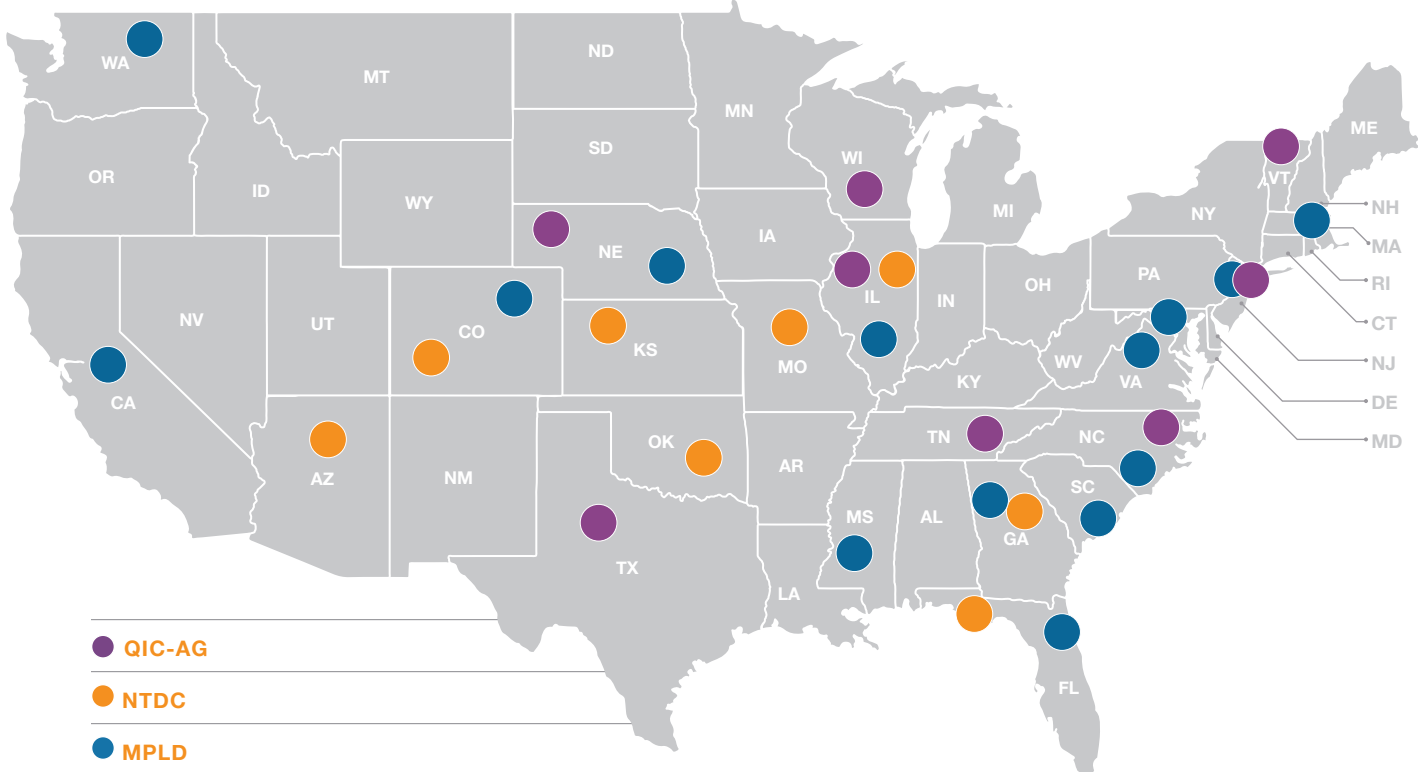
NTDC

The National Training and Development Curriculum (NTDC) is being developed to prepare foster and adoptive parents to effectively parent children exposed to trauma and to provide these families with ongoing skills development needed to understand and promote healthy child development.



MPLD

The Minority Professional Leadership Development (MPLD), a program of the AdoptUSKids project that promotes leadership development of minorities in the adoption field. There is no fee to participate in the structured program, which provides hands-on experience, exposure to national experts, and mentorship opportunities.



CHILD & FAMILY SERVICES

MATERNAL, INFANT, AND EARLY CHILDHOOD HOME VISITING (MIECHV)

A HEALTHY FAMILIES AMERICA - WAYNE PROGRAM

With the focus on the prevention of abuse and neglect through the provision of home and community based services, the Center has been successful in the prevention of out-of-home placement in 99% of the families served. This program provides home visitation, family support services, child development screening and referrals, parent education and linkages to community resources for low income families.

Mr. Thomas dedicated his life to helping children get adopted. SFC continues to work with his foundation, supported by Wendy's franchisees.

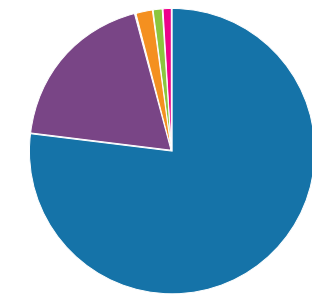

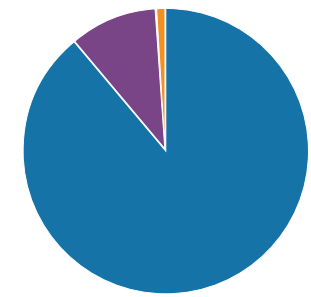

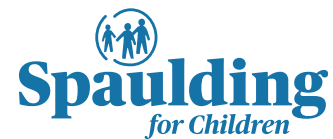
TOTAL EXPENSES \$10,904,130

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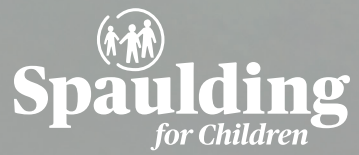
